

SUPPORT DISC GOLF IN KANSAS CITY

JOIN THE KANSAS CITY FLYING DISC CLUB

The Kansas City Flying Disc Club, a registered not-for-profit corporation, was established in 1988 with these goals: to promote the sport of disc golf, as well as other flying disc sports by (1) holding events and leagues for players of all skill levels; (2) issuing a newsletter to connect the membership, as well as other similar flying disc organizations, the media, and parks departments; (3) working in cooperation with the various park departments to maintain and improve the current courses, and to procure new courses; (4) offering for sale, flying discs and related equipment to members and other players at all courses at fair prices.

Working in cooperation with the various Parks and Rec Departments, the all-volunteer KCFDC continues to maintain and to improve the existing courses in the area—Swope, Water Works, Rosedale (Original and Down Under), Wyandotte County Park, Cliff Drive, Blue Valley, Prairie Center Park, Shawnee Mission Park, William Yates Elementary, Legacy Park, English Landing Park, and Pleasant Hill. Young Park in Blue Springs will open in May.

The Club runs weekly events during daylight savings time—open to members and non-members alike—for players of all skill levels at Prairie Center, and Cliff Drive on Mondays, Swope and Shawnee Mission Park on Tuesdays, Rosedale on Wednesdays, Water Works on Thursdays,

Wyandotte and Legacy on Fridays, and Pleasant Hill on Sundays. From November through March, there are weeklies on Saturday at Rosedale and Prairie Center.

The Club keeps its members informed with occasional calendars, newsletters, and at www.kcfdc.org. Club members receive discounts on merchandise purchased through the Club and at Disc Golf World, may play the Club Championship in the Fall, may participate in the Bag Tag Challenge, and have a say about disc golf in KC by voting for club officers and/or running for office.

Members of the KCFDC have been involved, in varying capacities, with the installation of all of the free-to-play courses in the metro area. In 1998, the Club won nine new baskets for having the most paid players (508) at the World's Biggest Disc Golf Weekend. Working with the Olathe Parks and Recreation Department, the Club redesigned and replaced all 18 holes to bring this course up to par with the area's other courses.

The beat goes on. As the 2010 season begins, we continue to monitor (and support as we can) initiatives to get courses in the ground in Smithville, Lenexa, and Independence. In addition, Hidden Valley Park might become KCMO's fifth course. The Club continues to work with the various Parks Departments to

enhance all the courses, including planting trees and shrubs at Swope, Rosedale, and Cliff Drive, building stairs and fighting erosion at Water Works and Cliff Drive, and funding other improvements.

Besides taking care of courses and running weeklies, the KCFDC runs or promotes special events, such as the 28th Annual Kansas City Wide Open that will held June 19-20 and KC Disc Golf Day on May 15th, when we will be celebrating disc golf in Kansas City. Since 1999, the KCFDC has hosted three PDGA World Championships event, including the large competitive disc golf event of all time in the summer of 2009 when 921 players attended the PDGA Pro-Am World Championship

We encourage you join the Kansas City Flying Disc Club (or to continue your membership) and become part of the growth of disc golf in Kansas City. The game, while relatively new, needs a strong club to connect effectively with the various governments on which our courses are located. We are one of the strongest clubs in the country, and we get things done. Come join us.
